## **Updated Syphilis Screening Recommendations for Correctional Settings in Arizona**

In light of ongoing statewide increases in <u>congenital syphilis</u> and syphilis in adults, the Arizona Department of Health Services has issued new recommendations for syphilis screening in **correctional settings** to improve linkage to <u>treatment</u>.

- **NEW: Implement opt-out screening prior to discharge** for people of childbearing capacity/pregnant people in correctional settings. Use rapid tests and treat if inmates are released prior to receiving test results and treatment.
- NEW: Implement opt-out screening for people with substance use disorder prior to discharge in correctional settings. Use rapid tests and treat if inmates are released prior to receiving test results and treatment.
- **Updated**: Include opt-out screening for syphilis in settings that serve people with addiction/Substance Use Disorder.

ADHS has also issued new general syphilis screening recommendations for Arizonans.

- NEW: Screen sexually active individuals aged 15 to 44 for syphilis annually (adopted from Centers for Disease Control and Prevention guidance).
- NEW: Implement opt-out screening for syphilis for pregnant people and people of childbearing capacity with unknown pregnancy status in Emergency Departments, Urgent Care, and other healthcare and/or outreach settings. In settings where follow-up is uncertain, it is recommended to use a rapid/point of care test and offer <u>same-day</u> <u>treatment</u> following a positive result <u>prior to discharge</u>.
- **Updated**: Include opt-out screening for syphilis in Emergency Departments, Urgent Care, and other healthcare and/or outreach settings that serve people with addiction/Substance Use Disorder.
